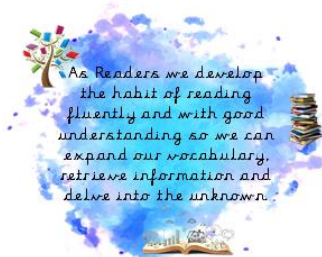

Communication and Language

Children are encouraged to ask simple questions about texts they have read.

Through whole class reading texts, children will be introduced to new vocabulary.

Children are beginning to understand how to listen carefully to gain knowledge and understanding.

Children will learn to retell a familiar story through the support of actions and images.



As citizens, we recognise and understand our own and others' needs, so we can make informed choices about our wellbeing.

Personal, social and emotional development

In PSED, children are learning that everyone is different and that it is good to celebrate differences between themselves and others. They will also be looking at their dreams and goals and how they can aspire to be anything.



As aspiring athletes, we are physically active so we can lead healthy lives and develop skills in a variety of activities. We compete fairly, both individually and within teams. We aim to win but we can accept defeat graciously.

Physical Development

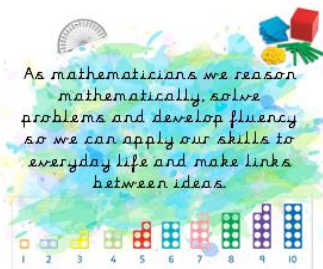
In PE, children are beginning to look at developing hand-eye co-ordination. They will be practise throwing accurately and with appropriate power. They will learn to control equipment as they roll them individually and with a partner.



As Writers we communicate clearly, accurately and coherently so we can purposefully express ourselves to a range of audiences.

Literacy

In literacy, children are learning RWI set 1 sounds, oral blending and segmenting words to begin to write CVC words. Children are also learning how to form letters correctly holding their pencil in the correct grip. Some children will also be beginning to read phonetically appropriate sentences in "ditties".



As mathematicians we reason mathematically, solve problems and develop fluency so we can apply our skills to everyday life and make links between ideas.



Mathematics

In maths, Children will continue to look at the composition of numbers up to 5 and begin to look at numbers beyond 5. They are continuing to developing careful counting using 1:1 correspondence and they will continue to subitise quantities up to 5. They will be beginning to compare quantities up to 5 using the terms more and fewer. They will also be learning to rapidly recall facts of one more and one less for numbers up to 5.

We will be looking at both standard and non-standard measurements through our themes and during continuous provision.



Understanding the World

Children are learning to problem solve through some of our big questions. They will be planning, creating, testing and reviewing different projects during this half term. We will be looking at materials in water, bread making, castle building, non-standard measurements and comparing them, and volcanoes. We will also be looking at comparing past and present through images from history.



Expressive Art and Design

Children will learn to retell the story of the little red hen through using actions and images. They will build and create different things for a purpose.



RE

Children will look at different celebrations across different religions. They will look at how people celebrate and will focus particularly on the religion of Hinduism.
