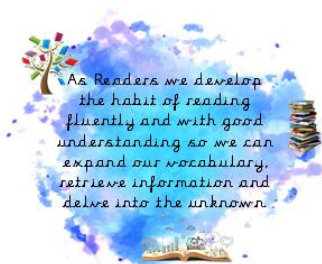

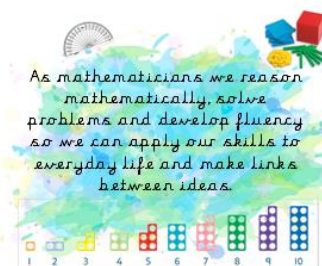
Reading

In reading, the children will continue to be exposed to a range of text types including poetry, fiction, non-fiction and playscripts. They will continue to develop their reading skills through the analysis of a variety of extracts. In addition to this, we will be exploring the text 'Beowulf'.



Writing

In English, the pupils will continue to build on their grammar knowledge - revising the different word classes and sentence structures. Pupils will be completing their biographies started last term and then will be using the text Beowulf to write their own 'Beat the Monster' story focusing on descriptive writing and creating atmosphere.



Mathematics

In maths, pupils will be exploring perimeter and area of rectangles and compound shapes. In addition to this they will be developing their knowledge of statistics by drawing and interpreting line graphs and two-way tables. Building on their prior learning of shape, pupils will be classifying, measuring and drawing angles.



Geography – My region and the Western United States

In this unit, pupils will recap on the key human and physical features of their region and discover the different countries and capital cities of North America. The pupils will focus on features of the Western United States including biomes, climate zones, earthquakes and volcanoes.



Art – How can layers of colour create a composition?

In this unit, pupils will investigate and explore post-impressionism as a movement and reflect on key artwork from the time period. In addition to this, they will explore the work of Henri Rousseau and study his composition techniques. Pupils will develop their use of colour and texture to create a jungle scene painting with layer of foliage and animals, like Henri Rousseau.



RE – What is the best way for a Sikh to show commitment to God?

Pupils will be considering the questions ‘does participating in worship help people to feel closer to God or their faith community?’ They will build on prior knowledge about the beliefs and practices of Sikhs.



French

During this half term, pupils will be learning to talk about different nationalities and languages as part of their conversational skills.



PE – Athletics and Yoga

Pupils will be practising a variety of events for their upcoming sports day as part of their weekly athletics session. Indoor PE will be yoga to help pupils to balance their emotional and physical health and to develop mindfulness techniques.



PSHE - Relationships

Children will be talking about their feelings and emotions and thinking about different ways they can regulate their emotions and feelings of anxiety when they occur.



Computing - Stop Motion Animation

This term, pupils will be creating animations, storyboard ideas and decomposing a story into small parts before putting together to create the illusion of a moving image.
